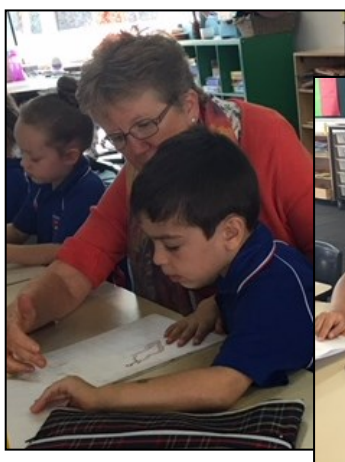
Mother's Day activities.

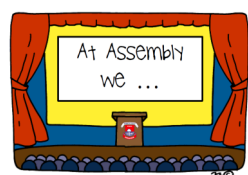
