Waste Audit – Monday 14th September

On Monday, Patrick Hamill from the Waste Authority visited our school to conduct a waste audit.

The purpose of the Waste Audit is to investigate the different types of materials we are throwing out and of that material, what can be recycled. The students from Room 1 emptied all of the school bins out and sorted through and weighed the different materials. They were able to move some materials to the co-mingled recycling, paper recycling and organics containers.

The goal for the rest of the term is to have zero organic (food scraps) material in the general waste bins. The students from Room 1 will be focusing on helping other students and staff to remember to recycle their organic material which goes to the chooks and worms.

When the results of the Waste Audit are emailed through, they will be displayed in a chart and made available to the rest of the school.
